The voice of young research universities in Europe

- YERUN Open Science Awards stem from the work of the YERUN Open Science Working Group
- Takes inspiration from UReading scheme, adapting it to our own needs and goals
- Target initiatives by **individuals or teams** of **researchers and/or professional support services** that demonstrate strong Open Science practices, and/or that support the scholarly community to adopt Open Science practices in their work.
- Project has to be already up and running at the moment of the application
- The application focuses on 4 main sections:
  - Description of the practice: what is the OS initiative about? Ο
  - Outputs: what has the initiative achieved so far? Ο
  - Reusability: what steps have been taken for others to reuse the initiative?
  - Follow-up: how does the applicant intend to use the award?



- Each application is submitted on a dedicated online platform and is assessed by a pool of evaluator
- Each application is randomly assigned to two evaluators (form different institutions than the applicant's)
- Each section of the application is scored from 1 (min) to 4 (max)
- The final score is the average of the points given to each application by the two evaluators.
- The system also automatically triggers a 3rd evaluator when the difference between the two scores by the two evaluators is 1.5 or more.
- Once all evaluations are completed, a threshold is set by looking at the applications with the highest score.
  The pre-selected applications are brought to the attention of a final evaluation panel, which by consensus
- The pre-selected applications are brought to the attention of a final decides on the 5 applications to be awarded.


